Nomination for the World Prize of Tunisia for Islamic Studies
(1438AH / 2017 AD)

The Ministry of Religious Affairs declares the opening of the applications for the World Prize of Tunisia for Islamic Studies at its tenth session in 2017 as from 01 April 2017 and over the following days; September 30, 2017 will be the last deadline for receipt of applications, according to the following objectives:

- Honor the scientific personalities as well as the cultural or scientific or academic influential organizations in the movement of contemporary Islamic culture,
- Contribute to the dissemination of values of religious moderation and the treatment of phenomena of extremism and immobility
- Contribute to the dissemination of the values of tolerance, coexistence and dialogue among civilizations, religions and peoples,
- Highlight the ability of Islamic thought to face the intellectual challenges and to answer all new questions,
- Encourage scientific research in the fields of Islamic studies by adopting a moderate and renewed Islam,

QUALIFICATION CRITERIA:

- 1- Must be written in French or Arabic or English,
- 2- Must be published in the two years preceding the year of the award of the Prize,
- 3- Must be of an average volume, between a minimum of two hundred and fifty pages (250 pages) or 50,000 words, written in Arabic or in one of the international languages in the field indicated,
- 4- Not accept any academic work or manuscript survey or holder of another prize.
- 5- Not be the work of a candidate who competed for another world prize under the year of the awarding of the world prize of Tunisia for Islamic studies.
- 6- The prize-winning candidate may only participate after five years,
- 7- Candidates jointly competing for the World Prize of Tunisia for Islamic Studies are required to provide with the application a co-signed agreement setting the share of each of them in case they win the prize
- 8- The study is presented in fifteen (15) copies
- 9- The application must be attached to the curriculum vitae of the candidate and a summary of the candidate's book not exceeding five pages in Arabic.
- 10- The first prize worth thirty thousand (30,000) dinars with a certificate of merit including the reasons for awarding the prize and a shield bearing the logo of that prize,

In case of equality between two or more scientific studies, the financial reward is divided equally among the winners with a certificate of merit and a shield bearing the prize logo.
