Program Contents

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Methodological Seminar (HIS09278D)

The SM contains 6 problem areas where students develop the syllabus:

- PC1. Questions of general purpose and method in history.
- PC2. Lessons of history for understanding the crisis.
- PC3. Methodological issues in art history.
- PC4. Family and collective in history: research approaches.
- PC5. History and historiography of science.
- PC6. Discussion about recent Portuguese history.

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Research Design I (HIS09282D)

This Seminar comprises 7 main Program Contents (PC):

- PC1. Time / Spaces. Particularities of the research and of the key issue in different chronological frameworks. Scales of analysis and advanced research design. Feasibility and relevance of the research issue.
- PC2. Bibliographical research: data management of references (Zotero) and advanced techniques of readings, conceptual analysis and critical assessment of the relevant literature. The archival research in the main repositories and in national and international archives.
- PC3. Data and textual analysis: basic skills on quantitative methods of analysis, network analysis, Content analysis techniques. Databases.
- PC4. Review of literature, formation and types of hypothesis and testing of the hypothesis. The role of interdisciplinary research.
- PC5. Writing techniques: how to quote and how to reference archival sources and bibliographical references.

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Seminário the Specialty E (Empire, Colonialism and Post-Colonialism) (HIS10051D)

This Seminar comprises 4 main Program Contents (PC):

- PC1. Empires: historiography, theory, concepts, and analytical categories.
- PC2. Colonialism: historiography, theory, concepts, and analytical categories.
- PC3. Post-colonialism: historiography, theory, concepts, and analytical categories.
- PC4. Selected topics.

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Research Design II (HIS10780D)

The Seminar comprises 3 main program contents:

- PC 1: Identification of persistent problems and questions in the development of the thesis project, based on the answers obtained out a proposed «Guide for the Elaboration of the Thesis Project».
- PC 2: Debate and revision, stemming from chosen theoretical texts, of specific methodological issues, conceptualization problems and broad time-space contextualizing frameworks.
- PC 3: Elaboration, oral presentation and written submission of the individual thesis project, commented on by teachers and fellow students.
